Friday, September 14, will be swarming with fun activities. A movie marathon runs from 1:30 to 9:00 P.M. A matinee showing of *A Bug's Life* begins at 2:00 P.M., and the classic sci-fi insect-monster movie *Them* runs at 8:00 P.M. Skip Elsheimer of AV Geeks will run educational bug films from his collection at 6:00 P.M. Cold War-era entomological education films, often unintentionally funny, will be shown throughout the day. **The Bug Cook-Off takes place from 7:00 to 7:50 P.M.**

The NCSU Libraries launched Bug-O-Rama to promote awareness of its entomology collections, which are among the best in the world.

The event is funded through a grant from Aventis CropScience, a worldwide business leader specializing in the research and development of innovative products in the life sciences.

The D. H. Hill Library is located on the NC State Brickyard, near the intersection of Hillsborough and Gardner streets, across from the Wachovia Bank building. It is wheelchair accessible.
