NCSU Libraries To Open Pulitzer Prize Photography Exhibition

The North Carolina State University Libraries presents ***The Pulitzer Prize Photographs: Capture the Moment***, a stunning traveling exhibition on Pulitzer Prize-winning photographs. **The exhibit, which is free and open to the public, will be held in the D. H. Hill Library on the NC State campus.** It will run from September 19 through December 13, 2003, and features 125 prize-winning images dating from 1942 through 2003.

Developed by the Newseum, the interactive museum of news, in association with Business of Entertainment, Inc., the exhibit includes many photos that are instantly recognizable. These include Joe Rosenthal's World War II photograph of the raising of the flag over Mount Suribachi on Iwo Jima in 1945 and many haunting images from the Vietnam War. The exhibit also includes includes photographs of Olympic events and of people in extraordinary situations. John H. White,

born in Lexington, N.C., received a Pulitzer in the feature photography category in 1982 for his portfolio covering a year in the life of Chicago. He currently works for the *Chicago Sun-Times*.

Cyma Rubin of the Business of Entertainment, Inc., is curator of the exhibit. She is a member of the Board of Directors of the Friends of the Library at NC State. She is also an alumna of NC State with a degree in textile management. She received an honorary doctorate of fine arts from NC State in 2003. Rubin wrote and co-edited the exhibit catalog and also produced and directed "Moment of Impact: Stories of the Pulitzer Prize Photographs," an Emmy Award-winning TV documentary examining six Pulitzer Prize-winning photographs. Both the catalog and a VHS copy of the TV documentary will be available for sale at the exhibit.

The Pulitzer Prize Photographs: Capture the Moment was developed by the Newseum, the interactive museum of news, in association with Business of Entertainment, Inc., of NYC. The Newseum, which is moving to Washington, D.C., is funded by the Freedom Forum—a nonpartisan foundation dedicated to free press, free speech, and free spirit for all people.
